Elsevier, Stanford University rank 2 MOUAU Scholars Among Top 2% Scientists in the World

Two scholars of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike (MOUAU) have been listed among top 2% scientists on earth by Stanford University, USA and Elsevier.

The scholars are Engr. Prof. MacManus Chinenye Ndukwu and Engr. Dr. Kennedy C. Onyelowe, both of the College of Engineering and Engineering Technology (CEET), MOUAU. In the 2024 ranking of research scientists globally, published on September 16 by Elsevier, a global information analytics company that helps institutions and professionals

to progress science, advance healthcare and improve performance, MOUAU's Prof. Ndukwu and Dr. Onyelowe were listed among 233 other Nigerian scholars who made part of the 2% top World Scientists for their outstanding research and scholarly publications in SCOPUS.


SCOPUS is a trusted source-neutral abstract and citation database that offers a comprehensive overview of global interdisciplinary scientific information, covering the areas of science, technology, medicine, social science and

MOUAU Greenhouse Project witnesses massive tomato harvest

One of the investments in massive crop production by the Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe's administration in Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike (MOUAU), has started yielding results.

The institution's Greenhouse Project has commenced the harvest of tomatoes from its state-of-the-art Greenhouse farm.



According to the Project Supervisor and the Director of the Centre for Gender, Youth and Child Development, Prof. Mabel Ifeoma Onwuka, the University has been harvesting



between 50-100 kilogrammes of tomatoes weekly for the past three weeks, with the harvest expected to continue for several weeks ahead.

Prof. Onwuka, in a chat with MOUAU News on Thursday, October 10, 2024, disclosed that the integrated nutrients management system, coupled with precision irrigation, has been instrumental in maintaining soil fertility and providing essential nutrients to the plants.

She further explained that a team of expert farmers in the University has applied best practices in tomato cultivation, resulting in the bountiful harvest that has been recorded so far.

MOUAU's Greenhouse farming initiative demonstrates the University's commitment to innovative agricultural practices, enhancing food security, and promoting sustainable farming methods.

A Greenhouse is a special agricultural structure that is designed to regulate the temperature and humidity of the environment inside.


