
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#### How Paul Promise Chibuike emerged MOU-AU's best graduating student with 4.92 CGPA

The Vice-Chancellor of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe, met pressmen as part of activities to kick-off the 12th Convocation Ceremony of the University, slated for Saturday, November 30, 2024.

During the press conference which was held at the Vice-Chancellor's conference room on Thursday, November 28, 2024, the Prof. Madu Ofo Iwe disclosed that the University has introduced the Departments of Food Engineering and Geology, as well the MOUAU Business School, as part of its expansion efforts.

During his address, the VC also reiterated that the current administration is succeeding in making MOUAU an entrepreneurial University in line with his vision of ensuring that it attains a level of enterprise that would enhance its resources. According to the VC, MOUAU's bread and biscuit factory, water production facility, and Guest House are steadily growing and enhancing the reputation of the University.

The Vice-Chancellor also stated that the University has intensified efforts in the training of competent students who would contribute their quote to the elimination of hunger in Nigeria, in line with the vision of the founding fathers of the University.

Prof. Madu Iwe, while briefing the press, disclosed







that the University has continued to engage in important linkages with like-minds and has established partnerships with over 62 universities across the globe.

In his response to questions from journalists on the University's delisted courses, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo lwe stated that plans are underway to reinstate the courses that were delisted from the College of Management Sciences (COLMAS), stressing that similar courses were also delisted from other Federal Government-owned Universities.

The University helmsman addressed concerns over the recent school fees increment, explaining that the charges were increased by less than 10% for utilities. According to the VC, the new N10,000 transportation fee for the entire year, for instance, is a reasonable increase from last year's N8,000, considering the rising fuel costs, maintenance and logistics for running the vehicles.

The VC also disclosed that the University is now assessing funds from the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFUND), after years of being

flagged yellow, which is now being used to develop its permanent site

Speaking further, Prof. Iwe revealed that this year's Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND) mark-up for the University is 150,000. He decried the nonchalance of students from the Southeastern part of Nigeria in accessing the funds, urging them to subscribe to it, as way of assisting their parents and guardians to easily pay their charges.
