2025 Founder's Day: Gov. Otti lauds Prof. lwe's leadership, legacies in MOUAU

he Executive Governor of Abia State, His Excellency, Dr Alex Chioma Otti, OFR, has commended the Vice-Chancellor of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe, CFS, for initiating and sustaining the Dr Michael Iheonukara Okpara Lecture in MOUAU and his purposeful leadership of the University since 2021.

The Governor, represented by the State's Commissioner for Agriculture, Dr. Cliff Agbaeze, made the remarks while addressing participants at the 2nd Dr. Michael Iheonukara Okpara Lecture, held on May 2, 2025 in a newly completed and furnished 1500-capacity Lecture Theatre in the University.

Said Dr. Otti: "Let me begin by congratulating the Vice Chancellor of this University, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe and his team for introducing the Dr M. I. Okpara bi-annual lecture and for his purposeful leadership in steering this great citadel of academic and moral excellence to greater heights since his assumption of office in 2021".

The Gov. further said: "permit me

to say that MOUAU has grown in leaps and bounds over the years particularly since his tenure, witnessing monumental strides in infrastructural and human capital development, which have contributed greatly to nation building".

Dr. Otti seized the opportunity to commend the Visitor to the University and Commander in Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, GCFR, for assenting to the Bill that established the South East Development Commission (SEDC) and appointing an Abia son, Dr. Emeka Wogu as its pioneer Chairman.

He called for collaboration among the State, SEDC and MOUAU to create a space for free enterprise imbued with innovation, where agripreneurs can thrive, thus making the Southeast a hub for a gricultural development.





Pro-Chancellor eulogizes late Dr. Okpara, charges leaders to embrace his ethos

he Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Governing Council of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike (MOUAU), Comrade Fidelis Chukwunweike Edeh, has eulogized the outstanding virtues of the late Premier of Eastern Region, Dr. Michael Iheonukara Okpara, and called on leaders in Nigeria to embrace his ethos in public service.

The remarks were contained in Comrade Edeh's goodwill

message to participants at the 2nd Dr. Michael Iheonukara Okpara Lecture organized by the University on Friday, May 2, 2025, at the newly commissioned modern Public Lecture Theatre of the University.

Comrade Edeh described late Dr. Michael Iheonukara Okpara as a trailblazer and an iconic leader who demonstrated courage in the face of social injustice and charted the most imaginative focal agro-industrial template Nigeria has ever seen.

He said late Dr. Okpara foresaw the

food insecurity challenges facing Nigeria today and had already laid out practical solutions through proactive policies. "He was imaginative and delivered results," Edeh noted, citing Okpara's legacies in agriculture, manufacturing, brewing, tourism, animal husband ry, farm settlements, and textiles.

The Pro-Chancellor also highlighted late Dr. Okpara's boldness in confronting colonial injustice, saying his leadership went beyond agriculture, into the realm of national courage and resistance.

Comrade Edeh urged leaders in public service to go beyond merely remembering late Dr. Okpara, but live out his ethos, which include imagination, innovation, selfless service and courage.

"I believe that Dr. Comrade Michael Okpara has invented the wheel of innovative agro-allied ventures - the reason for which this great institution was renamed after him, We must, therefore, cease from merely remembering him but must embrace the ethos of his public service."

MOUAU 2025 Founder's Day: VC excited as Pro-Chancellor commissions Modern Public Lecture Theatre

here was obvious excitement in the face of the 6th Vice-Chancellor of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe, CFS, when the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the University's Governing Council led other Council Members to commission an ultra-modern Public Lecture Theatre in the University on May 2, 2025.

The Vice-Chancellor went

down memory lane to describe how the building was conceptualized, commenced and now completed, and expressed his excitement that the Pro-Chancellor was on ground to commission the Theatre.

According to Prof. Iwe, the Theatre was a result of the persistent agitation of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) for better infrastructure in the Nigerian tertiary education system. He said that building of the

Theatre commenced d u r i n g t h e administration of the 4th Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Hilary Odo Edeoga, but could not be completed due to some funding issues. Furthermore, the administration of the 5th Vice-Chancellor led by the late Prof. Francis Ogbonnaya Otunta, could not conclude the project as well.

The 6th VC, however, gave glory to God that his administration confronted the brick walls that hindered the completion of the building and moved on to furnish it adequately with modern facilities that make it fit for public lectures and conferences. He expressed his joy that his administration's insistence that such a vital project should be put to its utmost use for the benefit of the University community had paid off.

Speaking during the Commissioning Ceremony, the Pro-Chancellor, Comrade Fidelis Chukwunweike Edeh, congratulated the Vice-Chancellor and University Management for their doggedness in ensuring that the Project was realized after a long time, quipping that the building came by the struggles of Comrades and waited until a Comrade Pro-Chancellor came to commission it.

MOUAU News reports that the completion of the 1,500 capacity Modern Public Lecture Theatre with a 600-capacity basement is a significant milestone for the University and has added to the remark able achievements of Prof. Iwe's administration in infrastructural development.










MOUAU 2025 Founder's Day: VC calls on SEDC to support MOUAU's research efforts

h e South East Development Commission (SEDC) has been called upon to consider supporting the innovative research efforts of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike (MOUAU), in its plans and programmes for the overall development of the South East Region.

The tireless 6th Vice-Chancellor of MOUAU, who seizes every opportunity to seek support for the University, made the call on Friday, May 2, 2025, while addressing dignitaries and participants who converged on the University for its 2025 Founder's Day Celebration and 2nd Dr. Michael Iheonukara Okpara Lecture.

According to the Vice-Chancellor, the SEDC could join the list of organizations and individuals who have made significant contributions to the University, helping her to record major milestones in its mandates of teaching and training, research and community service.

Prof. Iwe said: "The various arms and support organs of MOUAU are quite vibrant. In consonance with the institution's mandate, these outfits strive to enthrone a functional, sustainable, excellence-driven and productive research culture, especially in Agriculture, Science, Engineering, Technology and Management to solve societal problems, prioritizing the needs of the catchment areas and the nation".

The VC informed his audience that the University through its Research Directorate has been proactively hosting high level symposia, research exhibitions and conferences, adding that to ensure proper organization and management of research on a sustainable basis, appropriate administrative machinery has been put in place from the administrative level to the University Research Board (URB).

He noted that Commodity/Utility/Action based research has been identified in all Colleges, Centre and Schools of the University and that there are thirteen (13)multidisciplinary research programmes in the University, and that each programme constitutes teams that conduct research on various conceived aspects of the broad Research Programme.

According to the VC, the Research Teams are funded by both the University and TETFUND. He therefore called on the Southeast Development Commission to consider supporting the University's innovative research efforts, among other areas of assistance.


