MOUAU students resume for 2nd Semester 2024/2025 Session on April 6, begin Lecture April 7

tudents of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture will return to Campus on Sunday, April 6, 2025 for second semester of the 2024/2025 academic session.

According to the Academic Calendar approved by Senate of the University, lectures for the 2nd Semester would commence on Monday April 7, 2025 for the 16 weeks Semester.

The approved calendar indicates that registration is scheduled to commence same April 7 and end on Thursday, April 18, 2025, while late registration, including add/drop registration and applications for excess credit Monday, April 28, and Friday, May 2, 2025. The lecture period will span eleven weeks, ending on Friday, June 20, 2025. Following this, the university has designated the week of Monday, June 23, to Friday, June 27, 2025, for students' week activities.

Academic revision and moderation of examination questions are scheduled to take place from Monday, June 30, to Friday, July 4, 2025. The second semester examinations will then commence on Monday, July 7, 2025, and continue until Friday, July 25, 2025. At the conclusion of the examination period, all nongraduating students are expected

load, will take place between to vacate the campus as the academic session officially comes to an end. The consideration of results is set for Monday, August 4, 2025, while the university will resume for the 2025/2026 academic session on Sunday, October 5, 2025.

> With a total of sixteen weeks, the second semester includes eleven weeks of lectures, one week dedicated to student union activities. one week for revision, and three weeks for examinations. Students are encouraged to adhere to all deadlines and prepare adequately for the academic activities ahead.
