
Transfer Projects and White Paper Release during its 2025 Summit in China on Monday, April 14, 2025.

LTU recognizes 7 MOUAU's Inventions in its CSTTP



he League of Tropical Universities (LTU) has recognized and published some inventions by selected research scientists and engineers in Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike in its Collection of Science and Technology Transfer Projects (CSTTP), MOUAU News can authoritatively report.

The inventions, published by the Secretariat of the League in April 2025 include: Development of a Lever Actuated maize Shelling Machine for Rural Farmers by Nwogu Chukwunonso Nweze, of the Department of Mechanical Engineering; Biochar Fortified Fertilizer by Mabel Ifeoma Onwuka of the Department of Soil Sciences; and Dual Cross-beater Bambara Nutcrushing Machine and Bambara Nutmilling-sieving Machine by Ijeoma Francisca Ikechukwu of the Department of Mechanical

Engineering.

Other inventions that featured in the CSTTP Publication are: Integrated Oil Palm Fruit Digester-separatorscrew Press Machine by Bethrand Nduka Nwankwojike of the Department of Mechanical Engineering; Design of a Bubbling Fluidized Bed Gasifier for the Thermochemical conversion of Petiole by Ugwuodo Chijioke B. of the Department of Food Engineering, and Oil Palm Broom Processing Machine by Osinachi Stanley Onwuka of the Department of Mechanical Engineering.

Hainan University, China, spearheaded the compilation of the latest research achievements of LTU members across various fields including Seed Breeding and tropical High Efficiency Agriculture, Digital Intelligence Technology, Marine science and Technology, Liffe and Health, and Ecological

Civilization.

The inventions by MOUAU scientists, not only represent cutting-edge exploration and innovation, but also underscores the strong commitment and capabilities of the University in advancing science and technology innovation that serve critical national needs and promoting local industry upgrades and socio-economic development.

s part of his vision to truly internationalize Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe, CFS, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for academic partnership with the President of Hainan University, China, Prof. Qingming Luo.

The MoU was signed between the two Universities during the 2025 Summit of the League of Tropical Universities held in Hainan, Southern China recently, and aims at fostering international academic cooperation and knowledge exchange between MOUAU and Hainan University. MOUAU News reports that this MoU marks a significant milestone in enhancing academic and research collaboration between the two institutions. The agreement outlines several key areas of cooperation, including staff and student exchange at both undergraduate and graduate levels; joint research initiatives and academic conferences; sharing of information, publications and academic materials; and other mutually beneficial activities as agreed upon by both universities.

In a similar development, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Iwe, held productive meeting with the Dean of the HNU-ASU (Hainan University and Arizona State University) Joint International Tourism College of Hainan University (HAITC), Wang Lin, and signed a document ushering the College and MOUAU into a partnering relationship in Tourism.
