



Town Hall Meeting with students: VC asks students to reciprocate his Admin.'s commitment to a better MOU AU

The Vice Chancellor of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe, says his administration has worked tirelessly to provide a good learning environment for students, and therefore demanded that they begin to reciprocate to the commitment of his Administration towards a better University.

Prof. Iwe made the call during a town hall meeting held on Wednesday, May 28, 2025 at the university's mini stadium.

Speaking directly to the student body, Prof. Iwe highlighted the

efforts made by his leadership over the past four years to raise the academic and moral standards of the university.

"In the last four years, my administration has tried night and day to provide a good learning environment, as well as put in place the right processes for students to achieve the great goals for which our university was established," he said.

The Vice Chancellor also used the opportunity to announce new decisions reached by the University Senate aimed at improving discipline on campus. He disclosed that steps have been concluded to curb indecent dressing, examination malpractice, and other misconducts.

According to him, "You will be educated

by your departments and colleges on these changes, and a revised Student Information Handbook will be made available soon to guide your conduct."

Prof. Iwe further urged students to avoid immoral lifestyles and habits that could hinder their academic success. He strongly warned against cohabitation, drug abuse, alcohol consumption, and the smoking of illicit substances.

He concluded by encouraging students to uphold the values of the university, focus on their studies, and serve as positive examples within and outside the campus.
