# HNUD sets up nutri-fan club in UDSS, as VC commissions the School demonstration garden

In a bid to create awareness of the benefits of healthy eating among adolescents, the Ag. Head of Department of Human Nutrition and Dietetics, Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike (MOUAU), Dr. Patricia Ogechi Ukaegbu, has set up a Nutri-Fan Club in the University Demonstration Secondary School (UDSS), while the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe, commissioned a school garden.

Speaking during the event, Dr. Ukegbu, said the project aims to involve secondary school students in agriculture and nutrition early in life, as a strategic approach to improving dietary habits and hygiene among teenagers. She expressed optimism that the Nutri-Fan Club will serve as a practical guide to improve students' nutrition and general well-being.

Addressing guests during the event, the Vice-Chancdllor of MOUAU, Prof. Maduebibisi Ofo Iwe, who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Prof. Ursulla Ngozi Akanwa, applauded the Department for its impactful initiative. She emphasized the importance of eating balanced meals, particularly fresh fruits and vegetables, for the healthy growth of children and adolescents.

She also urged students and club members to replicate the gardening practice at home by





using sack bags, cement bags, or buckets to grow vegetables and crops, adding that even small efforts can contribute to better nutrition at the household level.

Stakeholders, particularly from Abia State Ministries, praised the initiative of Dr. Ukaegbu in setting up the Nuti-Fan Club and the the School Garden.

They described the Initiative as "timely and impactful, and noted that the project would boost food security in homes and rekindle interest in agriculture among students.
